### Religious Education (RE) Progression



#### Overview:

All children in our school are taught a weekly RE lesson. Learning sequences begin with big questions and children are encouraged to think deeply about their opinions, knowledge and understanding whilst exploring faith. Our curriculum is based on a spiral model where key concepts are revisited as children progress through the school, but each time there is further challenge as it is explored through a slightly different lens.

#### Aims for the Dorset RE Syllabus to help children:

- Develop an awareness of spiritual and moral issues in life experiences;
- Develop a knowledge and understanding of Christianity and other major world religions found in Britain;
- Develop an understanding of what it means to be committed to a religious tradition;
- Reflect on their own experiences and to develop a personal response to the fundamental questions of life;
- Develop an understanding of religious traditions and to appreciate the cultural differences in Britain today;
- Develop investigative skills and research skills and to enable them to make a reasoned judgment about religious issues;
- Have respect for other peoples' views and to celebrate the diversity in society;
- Explore and express their own thoughts and feelings and to reflect on and learn from their experiences

Our RE Curriculum follows the Dorset RE Syllabus expectation that pupils learn:

- At least two Abrahamic traditions, one of which must be Christianity (Christianity, Islam, Judaism)
- Two Dharmic traditions (Buddhism, Sanatana Dharma)
- one non-religious worldview (Humanism)

Our two year rolling programme ensures every year all pupils will have 50% of RE teaching time directed on Christianity
