

What is the Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is extra funding that the government gives to schools for each pupil considered to be 'disadvantaged'. Pupil Premium funding allows schools to target additional support for children and ensure that they do not fall behind their peers. Who receives the Pupil Premium?

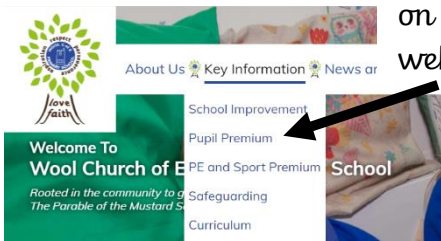
Funding criteria	Amount of funding for each primary-aged pupil per year
Pupils who are eligible for free school meals, or have been eligible in the past 6 years	£ 1,480
Pupils previously looked after by a local authority or other state care	£ 2,570
Children who are looked after by the local authority	£ 2,570

How do we spend Pupil Premium funding?

- Staff training and resources to provide high quality teaching
- TA time and resources to deliver interventions and small group phonics, maths and English sessions.
- Weekly sports coach lessons, which enable the teacher to run conferencing 'catch-up' sessions.
- Small group tutoring in maths and English.
- Pastoral support through ELSA and check-in sessions.
- Insurance for Murphy, the school welfare dog!



Did you know, children who receive Pupil Premium funding are entitled to:

Free hot school meals
Free uniform items bearing the school logo
Discount on the Year 5/6 residential trip!

Some free weekly sessions of wrap-around care
£30 to spend on further wrap-around care, school trips, after-school clubs or extra uniform!



What is the Service Premium?

The Service Premium is a separate grant for pupils who have a parent serving in the armed services. Unlike the Pupil Premium, this grant is not solely for raising attainment but for providing additional support (mainly pastoral)
