Dear Families,

This week began with our Odd Socks Day as we launched Anti-Bullying Week 2025. The theme this year is Power for Good and the children have engaged with an assembly and activities aimed at empowering young people to use their Power for Good to safely speak up and raise awareness when they see bullying, face to face or online. We all have a part to play and we want to work together to use our Power for Good to end bullying - for good.

On Tuesday we held a short period of silence as part of our acts of remembrance. Last weekend many children and their families took part in Remembrance parades across our parish.
