Dear Families,

This week has continued to be busy, and the children in Kingfisher Class have even decorated Holy Rood Church with flowers for the weekend. We greatly appreciate the strong links we share within our community, and I know the children took great care over their display.

A key focus for us as we continue into the summer term is ensuring that every child arrives at school fully prepared for a successful day of learning. We are grateful for your continued support in ensuring pupils come through the school gates each morning having had a drink/some breakfast, wearing the correct uniform and with all the necessary items they need for the day ahead.

School uniform plays an important role in shaping the ethos of a primary school by creating a strong sense of belonging and shared identity. When all children wear the same uniform, it reinforces the idea that everyone is part of one community; where individuals are valued equally regardless of background. This helps to reduce distractions and promote pride and high expectations. If ever you have concerns or queries around our uniform policy, please do just come and speak to us.

These small but important routines make a significant difference to children's confidence, wellbeing and readiness to learn.
